Operation Swift Justice

'Operation Swift Justice,' Zero Tolerance Initiative in Response to increased violence in the City of Paterson

Paterson -- In direct response to the recent uptick of gun related violence in the City of Paterson, "Operation Swift Justice," is being launched in time for the New Year. This new initiative is designed to dissuade any further escalation and send a direct message that our police department will take whatever proactive measures deemed necessary and appropriate to ensure the safety and security of the City of Paterson community.

The Paterson Police Department, in conjunction with our partners in both state and county law enforcement, will launch a massive strategic police initiative that will blanket the City of Paterson with members of the Paterson Police Department, Passaic County Sheriff's Department, Passaic County Prosecutor's Office and the New Jersey State Police.

Named "Operation Swift Justice" this zero tolerance-based initiative will be an aggressive response to recent criminal activity with an intensified police presence. And will forge a synchronized and swift response designed to balance spirited crime fighting efforts while safeguarding constitutional rights and civil liberties.

The Paterson Police Department will deploy members of the Patrol Division, Cease Fire Unit, Emergency Response Team, Traffic Division and Narcotics Division as well as support from the Passaic County Prosecutor's Office providing resources and technology.

The Passaic County Sheriff's Department and the New Jersey State Police will provide both uniformed and plain clothes officers along with the deployment of undercover street crime units throughout the city.

In addition, the City's Shot-spotter, camera and gunshot detection system, mobile cameras, license plate readers, lighting and hot spot crime mapping software will be utilized to aid in deploying resources.

As we approach the New Year, this operation will incorporate the core principles of the Mayor's Safe City Initiative that encompasses federal, state, county and community stakeholders in a synchronized effort that focuses on the 1-2% of violent criminals in our city who are responsible for the majority of crimes.

Operation Swift Justice will be a collaborative group effort whose focal point will be deterrence through targeted enforcement efforts of groups involved in the cycle of violence.
