Mayor's Farewell Message





Thank you citizens of Paterson. It has been my honor to be your Mayor for the last approximate 8 months. When I first embarked on this adventure, I viewed it as my duty to the city I love. However, while I hope that I have left the City of Paterson a little better as a result of my efforts, this city has given me much more by allowing me to serve. It is a daunting task to govern the third largest city in the state. People ask me where you get the energy. The simple truth is that the energy comes from the citizens of Paterson. I have been able to complete this task as a result of the support and active efforts of each and every one of you.

As your Mayor, I appointed a new police chief and fire chief. I know that Police Chief Oswald and Fire Chief McDermott will use all their efforts to keep the citizens of Paterson safe. Our police and fire departments have grown through a series of promotions of deserving individuals including Captain Lourdes Phelan, our first female Deputy Police Chief and Lt. Elizabeth A. Fournier, first female Fire Captain. We are remaking our public service departments to not only keep us safe, but also to interact and communicate with our community at large. In our Community Development Department, faith based and non-profit organizations have continued to build and expand utilizing block grants and other city supports. In my tenure as Mayor, I have been able to cut a ribbon on a new Walgreen Pharmacy, beauty parlor, bodega, and the bridge dedication honoring our late Councilmen, Kenneth and Donald Hayden. I even opened a dog park. For the first time, the State of New Jersey chose to hold their historic preservation conference in Paterson acknowledging our efforts and commitment to further developing our historic district and supporting our national park. Our Public Works Department has been assisting us in cleaning and improving our local parks. My Department of Health & Human Services partnered with the county and several other divisions to open up a homeless shelter this winter to protect our must vulnerable residents and establish a hotline to insure that no resident in the City of Paterson will go without heat when it is cold.

However, I am most proud of the Mayor's Student Ambassador Program. I instituted this program for 7^{th} graders, 8^{th} graders and high school juniors and seniors. It involved student volunteers from 45 schools from within the City of Paterson. This is the first program that has brought together students in both the public and charter schools. Among the many projects that these young people accomplished were community clean up, painting, beautifying, tutoring, community interaction with our police and fire departments, and even encouraging Paterson students to all get library cards. These young people reflect the beautiful diversity of the City of Paterson. They are full of energy and optimism. They are our investment in the future leaders of Paterson. I would like to especially thank Superintendent, Eileen Shafer and Executive Director of Information Services, Terry Corallo for their dedication to the students and our Board of Education.

During my time as Mayor, I have been welcomed by every ethnic group within this city. I have been honored to be invited to participate in cultural and religious events from all groups. It has always been my mission to represent every citizen of Paterson. Our faith in this city is what joins us together despite our differences. I thank you again for the opportunity to serve you. I am proud to have been your Honorable Mayor. On July 1st, the City will enter into its next chapter and I will return to the most important title of all - honorable citizen of Paterson.

At parent/child classes, you can play, bond and move with your baby and toddler!



At the Paterson YMCA our Mommy and Me classes aren't just for mommies.

Kids ages 6 months – 5 years are free to explore, create and learn with their mom, dad or any caregiver. This is your first opportunity to expose your infant to the wonderful world of water and safety.

The focus for this class is to ensure your baby's first experience is a positive one by guiding both the baby and parent in basic water orientation.

You and your child will experience a class filled with personal safety skills, beginner swimming techniques and basic water adjustment.

Tuesdays and Thursdays 6:30pm-7:15pm

Monthly sessions last four weeks and begin the first Tuesday of every month. The last scheduled class of the month is reserved for open swim.

Children are required to wear a swim diaper .

Registration is held and prequired the last week of the month prior to the next monthly session and is on a FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED basis.

Minimum of five (5) persons is required for each session.
