

DISCUSSION ITEMS

The Allied Textile Printing site (ATP site) is located at the corner of Mill and Van Houten Street in the Great Falls Historic District. It is a 6-acre site of industrial ruins including the Colt Gun Mill where Paterson's first factories began in 1792. ATP is owned by the City of Paterson and is included within the Great Falls National Historical Park boundary. The site has been reserved for preservation due to its historic significance and archaeological sensitivity. ATP is also a brownfield site and contains contamination that must be addressed. Reclaiming the ATP site requires abating environmental contamination on balance with strategic preservation of cultural resources such as ruins and archaeological materials.
