## School Based Youth Services

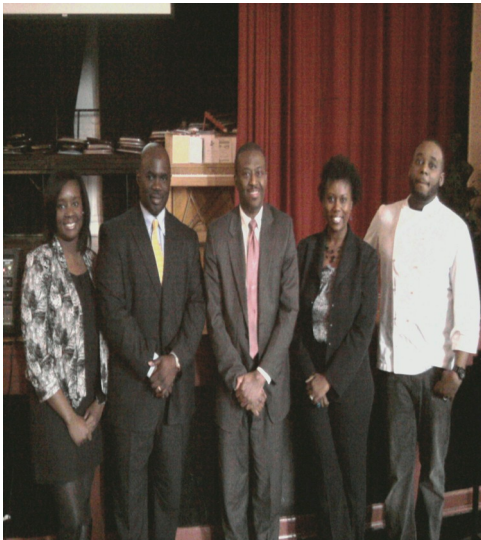

## Recycling

**ATTENTION PATERSON RESIDENTS YOU CANNOT PUT ELECTRONICS IN TRASH...**

***This includes: COMPUTERS, TV'S, ELECTRONICS, WHITE GOODS/METALS***

As a result of **New Environmental Laws**, TV's, computers, and other electronics can no longer be collected with **regular household trash**. Do not put electronics out on your normal scheduled garbage pick-up day as it will not be picked up. Instead, these items must be placed on the curb after you place a call to the Recycling Office to arrange a pick-up. Note: That refrigerator doors must be removed prior to placing on the curb for pick-up. Failure to do so may result in a littering fine.
