## PUBLIC NOTICE - SNOW REMOVAL

### **\*UPDATE\* PUBLIC NOTICE: SNOW REMOVAL AND SALTING OPERATIONS**

Paterson residents, there will be ongoing snow removal and salting operations following the recent winter storm, which delivered approximately 15 inches of snow.

#### **Actions Already Completed:**

- City streets have been salted and plowed.
- Snow removal has been completed in the following streets:
  - Main St. and ending on Main St. & Levine St.
  - Park Ave from Madison Ave to Straight St.
  - Market St from Straight St. to Madison Ave.
  - 21st Ave from East 22nd St. to Straight St.
  - Union Ave from Richmond Ave to West Broadway
  - 10th Ave from East 16th St. to Route 20.
  - Main St. from Barclay St. to Memorial Drive
  - 21st Ave from East 22nd St. to Market St.
  - Broadway from Memorial Drive to Madison Ave
  - Totowa Ave from Preakness Ave to Ryle Ave
  - Trenton Ave from Crooks Ave to 21<sup>st</sup> Ave

#### ***Important Parking Notice:***

**All vehicles must be removed from the streets during scheduled snow removal. Vehicles may return to their parking spots once snow clearing is complete on their street; cars do not need to remain off the street all day.**
