- The Paterson Seniors Association, NJ Non Profit Organization will complete their 501 (c) 3 application this
 month and will soon be able to write, submit and receive grants on all levels, i.e., city, county, state and
 federal;
- DSS will expand outreach services to Paterson Veterans. If all goes well the Division of Senior Services will become the Division of Senior Services & Veterans Affairs;
- Rent Leveling Division reports 696 foreclosures recorded from March 2011 to date.
- Planning and Program Analysis immediately following Council approval, several non profit agencies will receive social service grant award letters. That's the good news however it is unfortunate that our budget has been drastically cut and our reach is limited.
- Youth Services Bureau Teens to be Heard has recently celebrated their first year. If you need to know

- ♦ Mercantile Inspector reports collecting revenue totaling \$47,950 for 2013. Since this Inspector has been in position he has contributed to the city's revenue by \$50,000 annually since 2011.
- Weights & Measures Inspector continues to work diligently on behalf of the citizens to ensure scales for our gas stations, jewelry stores, pharmacy's, Laundromats, etc. are accurate.
- Ryan White continues to provide funding and support to agencies serving individuals and/or families living with HIV and/or AIDS
- Paterson Municipal Alliance is moving right a long as the Steering Committee and Coordinator work together to have a positive impact on educating youth and adults on the issues relative to alcohol, tobacco and other drugs.

Is your landlord is responsible for supplying heat and maintaining the heating system but your apartment is still cold?

Then you have the right to file a "No Heat Complaint" when:

- After you have notified or attempted to notify your landlord and/or property manager where reasonable time has elapsed and landlord has failed to restore the heat.
- The temperature in your home is 68 degrees Fahrenheit or below and the outside temperature is 55 degrees Fahrenheit or lower during daytime hours (6:00am-11:00pm).
- During night-time hours (11:01pm and 5:59am) if the temperature of your home is 55 degrees Fahrenheit or lower and the outside temperature is 40 degrees Fahrenheit or lower.



Recycling Initiative Program



Recycling Carts are being delivered to Paterson Residents who registered for the Recycling Initiative Program and are committed to participate in the City of Paterson's Recycling Curbside Collection. The initiative that is being led by the Department of Public Works Recycling Division and supported by the Administration, the City Council, City's newly formed Environmental Commission and Paterson Public Schools. Containers being delivered are available in 35 gallon and 65 gallon sizes.

DPW has completed Phase 1 of the recycling container distribution which began November 4, 2013. Over 2100 containers were delivered during in Phase I.

Phase 2 for cart registrations through the Recycling Initiative Program will start after January 1, 2014. Information regarding the new registration dates will be posted on the City website and on Department of Public Works Facebook page. **Above all please recycle!**
